Feedback Analysis for 2015-2016

The academic year 2015-2016 commenced with the induction by Mr. Shreedhar Parundekar, our aluminous and brand protection manager of Mercedes Benz, Pune.

In this academic year, first semester commenced from 1/7/2015 and concluded on 29/10/15. The second semester commenced from 26/11/2015 and concluded on 30/4/2015.

Since the last academic year, we have started the practice of analyzing Feedback of various processes. The feedback of the academic year 2014-2015 was kept before the meeting of Local Management Council and suggestions were taken from the authorities. It was suggested that various innovative methods and use of technology should be adopted for making entire teaching-learning process more able and efficient. Further the LMC also gave the suggestion to take the feedback from students about the curriculum delivery and feedback from parents about the institution and various aspects of learning process. The IQAC established in the college laid down the parameters for analyzing feedback. This analysis is done in accordance with it.

Suggestions made by the LMC were attempted to be implemented by throughout the academic year. To ascertain performance of the college, in this academic year following feedback processes were implemented:-

1. **Faculty Feedback from students:** - Feedback of every fulltime faculty regarding the subject taught by them is taken in every semester.
2. **Student Feedback from advocates/law firm providing internship/placement:-** Feedback from advocates and law firms providing internships to our students is collected and analyzed.
3. **Parent Feedback:** - Parents feedback about their experience with the college and their opinion about the curriculum is taken and analyzed.

4. **Students Feedback:** - Last year student's feedback is collected and processed for understanding the performance of the college as well as the sufficiency of the curriculum delivery.

5. **Event Feedback from participants:** - Feedback about various events organized by the college is taken from the participants

Observations:-

1. Average feedback of faculties is found be more than 60% which as per the parameters set out by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell, is satisfactory.
2. Feedback received from advocates under whom SCLC students interned is found to be satisfactory. Many lawyers expressed the need to recognize the importance of practical training in curriculum designed by University.
3. Analysis of student's feedback depicts the need to modify the university syllabus. Some of the students have mentioned the need to reform the syllabus taking in consideration the developments in the legal field and challenges faced by the modern society. Some of the students have given suggestion to make moot court compulsory from first year.
4. Parent's feedback also expressed the need to provide specialized training in specified area such as corporate, cyber crimes etc.
5. As per the report of the third Justice P.B. Sawant National Moot Court the overall feedback regarding hospitality, management, food arrangement is very good. There are few suggestions regarding the arrangement of accommodation of boys and girl team member of the same team to be made in the same room. but it was decided that this suggestion is not feasible to implement.

Action Taken Report

Action Taken:-

1. In the academic year 2015-2016, the detail analysis of feedback received was done and The feedback received from different stakeholders was discussed in the staff meeting held by the Principal
2. The faculty feedback was communicated to each faculty in person.
3. Suggestions, Counseling and Support have been provided to concerned faculty for teaching-learning performance improvement.
4. Suggestion with respect to arrangement of accommodation of boys and girl team member in the same room was discussed and it was decided not to be feasible to implement.
5. Suggestions regarding change in the university syllabus were communicated to the University through the faculty representatives working on various statutory committees constituted by the University. It was decided to expand the scope of the activities of Moot Court Association to enable more participation of students in mooting activity,
6. This Feedback Analysis Report is forwarded to the IQAC and LMC for further discussion and recommendations.
