Feedback analysis for 2016-2017

Date- 15/4/2017

In the academic year 2016-2017, the first semester commenced on 15/6/2016 and concluded on 22/10/16. The second semester commenced on 21/11/2016 and concluded on 2/5/2017. This year as the law college completed the journey of 12 years, throughout the academic year series of events were conducted. The college inaugurated the academic year at the auspicious hands of Justice K.G. Balkrishnan, Former Chief Justice of India and former Chairman of National Human Rights Commission. To improve performance and quality of the college and to implement some of the suggestions given by its stakeholders, the following initiatives were taken by the college:-

- **Center for Advanced Legal Research and Training:-** With the objective of bridging the gap between theory and practice the College established the '**Center for Advanced Legal Research and Training**'. Through this center various courses in modular forms are conducted by the college for the betterment of students.
- **Moot Court Association:** - The Moot Court Association was established in the College in the last academic year. This year many activities were conducted through this association for developing mooting skills among students. It conducted various intra collegiate competitions regarding moots, client counseling etc.
- **Socrates Debate Club:-** The College also established the Socrates debate society for motivating the debating skills among our students.

For evaluating the performance of the college, we have following feedback processes:-

1. **Faculty Feedback:-**This academic year 10 full time faculties along with the visiting faculties discharged the function of teaching the curriculum to students. Every year feedback of faculty members is taken from students in the structured format. Criteria wise evaluation of teacher such as Punctuality of teacher, substance in teaching, command on

language, subject knowledge of teacher, ability to clarify, approach towards the class and impact of teaching i.e. knowledge enrichment of student, maintenance of student interest and ability to handle class nuisance is done through this feedback.

2. **Student Feedback from advocates/law firm providing internship/placement:-**
Feedback from advocates and law firms providing internships to our students is collected and analyzed.
3. **Parent Feedback:** - Parents feedback about their experience with the college and their opinion about the curriculum is taken and analyzed.
4. **Students Feedback:** - Last year student's feedback is collected and processed for understanding the performance of the college as well as the sufficiency of the curriculum delivery.
5. **Event Feedback from participants:** - Feedback about various events organized by the college is taken from the participants

4. Participants of Justice P.B. Sawant Forth National Moot Court competition gave the suggestion for changing the pattern of competition. The overall feedback with respect to the accommodation, food arrangement and hospitality is observed to be excellent.
